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## CONDITIONS OF PLAY

### A - GENERAL COMPETITION CONDITIONS

- All events to be played as per specified guidelines in this document. Failure to do so may result in disqualification or ineligibility to win daily competition but their score must be accepted for handicap purposes.
- Any issue not covered in this document will be decided by the QPGC Match Committee and/or authorised members (if applicable).
- All bookings for competition rounds must be made within the allocated Club times as displayed in MiClub Bookings.
- Before starting play in a competition, a player must register their intention to compete by paying an entry fee at the Golf Shop.
- MiScore is the preferred method to be used for recording singles competition scores. Instructions for its download and use are available within the MiScore APP Menu or Queens Park Golf Club Website.
- All pre-printed MiClub cards issued for special events are to be fully completed by entering scores and recording dots in the right-hand side of actual strokes taken. This enables cards to be scanned. Also, for recording number of drives per player when required in some partner competitions. Cards are to be signed by player and marker prior to submitting.
- If Golf Shop scorecards are in use. These cards must be completed with, the date, GolfLink number, scores, together with both player's and marker's signatures, prior to submitting (to confirm scores are correct) for the daily competition, into Box or other specified collection point.
- Cards are to have legible writing. Any unreadable cards or scores will be processed at the higher assumed score. If names are illegible, and not identifiable, scorecard may not be processed.
- Once cards have been submitted into Club scorecard Box or other specified collection point, cards will be considered finalised. If incorrect or incomplete after submission, the player or team may be disqualified from the daily competition and ongoing competitions (in case of multi-round competitions).
- Team event cards will be printed, as entered, into the MiClub booking system (online booking). In the case of all 2-person team events, Player 1 will be teamed with Player 2, Player 3 will be teamed with Player 4. If booking through the Golf Shop, please ensure you have advised the staff member which players will team up for the competition.
- In the case of a protest, the Club must be made aware of any issue, in writing, before the end of the daily competition. Any protest will be taken to the Match Committee for a ruling before the competition is finalised and prizes are awarded. Please approach either of the Club Captains or, if not present, a member of the Match Committee for a ruling or clarification before making a formal protest.
- Wednesday women's competition. Anyone wanting to play nine holes must play at the end of the field or allocated tees on MiClub bookings timesheet, unless changed by the match committee.
- A player cancelling from a partnered event, such as 4BBB, MUST notify their partner and remove their booking from MiClub online. Wherever possible the player should seek another player to fill the place. If another player cannot be located, then the relevant Captain should be notified. If the cancellation is within the last 24 hours before play, the player should notify their partner, remove themselves from the booking on MiClub and notify the Golf Shop.
- Handicaps: Men and Women Members maximum Australian Handicap is 54.
- Match Committee, or their representative may, in the event of inclement weather, insufficient entries or other safety reason, shorten, postpone, change, or abandon any competition of the day. (Refer to Extreme Weather Policy)
- Ride on carts may be used in all Club competitions.
- All players playing in Competition must adhere to the Dress Code set by the Club.
- Consuming alcohol or drugs on the course proper during competition games is not permitted.
- Course Ground-staff. No member(s) shall approach the City of Geelong Greens Staff. This is the prerogative of the Club Captains, on matters concerning the golf course and the facilities.

## **B. TIMESHEET/BOOKING SHEET – DAILY COMPETITIONS**

- Where deemed necessary –
  - The Club may alter or move competitors' bookings and tee times in daily timesheet to another timeslot without prior notice to competitor.
  - Bookings may be altered or moved at any time prior to allocated tee off time.
  - It is up to the competitor to make themselves aware of any changes to their tee time prior to teeing off, subject to below.
  - Players can confirm tee time with Golf Shop staff when registering for the daily competition. Any late change to tee time (after registration) will be advised by the Golf Shop staff member or tee steward on duty before the allocated tee off time.
  - All effort will be taken to keep requested tee times and, where possible, notify player of any change/s prior to the day of play.
  - Competition timesheets are available Online for members to use 14 days (13 days at 3.00pm, prior for Saturday) before the competition is played. Players require their Golflink No and a password to access the Timesheet on MiClub through the Queens Park Golf Club website.
  - For guidelines on member guests and visitors playing in the competition field refer to GUESTS and VISITORS section E. below.

## **C. THE RULES OF GOLF**

All club competition matches are to be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf. It is the responsibility of each player to know and understand their obligations under the Rules of Golf in conjunction with any QPGC Local Rules applicable at the time and apply them during their play. It is the responsibility of every member in a group to provide correct advice as to the Rules, to less experienced players and to bring a player's attention to any breach and advise the penalty involved. The application of the Rules is NOT just the responsibility of the marker, it is everyone's responsibility.

## **D. NEW MEMBER SPECIFIC**

- A new financial member may play in competition timeslots (in single person events) to submit scorecards to count towards them gaining their handicap (minimum 3 cards required).
- Cards to be submitted for handicapping must be marked and signed by a member of a Club affiliated with Golf Australia and who holds a current GA handicap. Markers Golflink number must also be included on the card they have marked before submission.
- As soon as a handicap is obtained, financial members may win the competition of the day and be able to compete in Club events as specified in individual and team competitions/event requirements.
- New members not holding a current handicap and Golflink number cannot mark a competitor's card.

### **D.1. JUNIOR MEMBER SPECIFIC (under 18's)**

- The club captains have the absolute discretion as they see fit to require a junior player to play with an adult club member in club competitions.
- Junior members may mark an adult's card.

### **D.2. SENIOR MEMBER SPECIFIC (men aged 70 or over)**

- Senior Events for men are for anyone over the aged 70 or over at time of competition start date.
- Senior members must supply date of birth to the Club to be eligible for Senior Events. (i.e. Comps for members aged 70-years old or over only).

## **E. GUESTS & VISITORS**

- Guests from other Clubs may play up to six times a year in QPGC competitions. The Match Committee retains the right to decline any Guest entry at their sole discretion.
- After 6 rounds have been played in competition, the guest must become a financial member of Queens Park Golf Club to play in any further competition timeslot.
- Approved guests may win competition and/or other prizes allocated for the daily competition.
- A guest is not eligible to win or to qualify for any Trophy, Club Medal, or Board event.
- A guest must hold a current GA handicap to be eligible for competition prizes.
- A QPGC member cannot continue in a multi-round partner event if playing with a guest. They can win the competition prize/s for the day.
- Presidents, Captains or Secretaries of golf clubs affiliated with Golf Australia and SWGA Board members may be introduced as visitors without payment of any fees.

## **F. ALL COMPETITIONS - GENERAL DISQUALIFICATIONS**

Any Player who has not returned their scorecard (NCR) or has a disqualified score or scorecard will not be eligible for or be included in:

- Daily competition prizes
- Ball competition
- Eclectic or Putting comps (for that day)

A Player who is disqualified IS entitled to prizes won prior to their disqualification which include:

- Nearest the Pins
- Gobblers
- Birdies
- Eagles
- Hole in one
- 9 Holes out or 9 holes in, whichever is applicable.

## **G. DAILY COMPETITION HANDICAP GRADES & PRIZE PAYOUTS – MEN.**

- For applicable competitions and events, the number of grades will be decided by the number of entries. As follows:
  - Less than 8 players – NO COMPETITION
  - 8 – 40 players = 1 Grade
  - 41 – 80 Players = 2 Grades
  - Over 81 Players = 3 Grades
- Handicap separations for daily grades are:
  - 1 Grade –
    - All Players entered in competition.
  - 2 Grades –
    - A Grade -9 – 17 (Daily Handicap)
    - B Grade 18 – 54 (Daily Handicap)
  - 3 Grades –
    - A Grade -9 – 13 (Daily Handicap)
    - B Grade 14 – 20 (Daily Handicap)
    - C Grade 21 – 54 (Daily Handicap)

### **EAGLES/HOLES IN ONE**

Eagle and Hole-in-one payouts are as follows:

- Each daily competition will have a \$20 payout for eagles.
- Each daily competition will have a \$30 payout for a Hole-in-one.
- Multiple competitors are eligible for an eagle or a hole-in-one on the same day.

## DAILY COMPETITION PAYOUT'S

- Competition Payout breakdown
  - Grade winners will receive \$40 per grade on Saturdays and \$30 per grade on other days. (where applicable, see below).
  - Grade runners-up will receive \$20 per grade on Saturdays and \$15 per grade on other days. (where applicable, see below).
  - Balls will be paid to top % of field, proportionate to remaining overall daily % limits.
  - Not all competitions will have runner-up prizes.
  - All competition payouts will be subject to the following:
    - No more than 70% of competition fees taken is to be paid out as prizes.
    - Eagles and Holes-in-one payouts do not affect daily competition percentage payouts.
    - There may be variations to payout figures specified above, subject to Mens Club Captain's (or authorised representative's) absolute discretion.

## **H. MENS TROPHY EVENTS – UPDATED December 2024**

### PRESIDENTS TROPHY

3 Rounds of PAR as set in the current Club Fixture.

- In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided by countback as recommended by Golf Australia.
- Club to supply trophy. Trophy to be presented at Club Presentation.

### CAPTAINS TROPHY

Best 3 out of 4 rounds of Stableford as set in the current Club Fixture.

- In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided by countback as recommended by Golf Australia.
- Club to supply trophy. Trophy to be presented at Club Presentation.

### SUMMER TROPHY

3 rounds of Stroke with nett scores to count as set in the current Fixture.

- In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided by countback as recommended by Golf Australia.
- Club to supply trophy. Trophy to be presented at Club Presentation.

### CLUB TROPHY

3 rounds of Stableford as per the current Fixture.

- If a winner still hasn't been decided, the result will be calculated on countback as recommended by Golf Australia.
- Club to supply trophy. Trophy to be presented at Club Presentation.

### CLUB MEDALS (INC. MEDALIST OF MEDALISTS)

There are 4 Club Medal days as per the current Fixture.

Medal Days to be played as Stroke format, with play to be from the GA permanent markers.

- In the event of a tie, the winner will be the player with the lowest score in the following Stroke Event competition as per Fixture.
- If a player tied for medal does not play, the medal is considered forfeited.
- If all tied players do not play in next fixtured stroke event, Medal will be carried to the following Stroke Event until finalised.

### MEDALIST OF MEDALISTS

Stroke round as per the current Fixture.

- Winners of the Club medals to compete for this competition, with play to be from the GA permanent markers.
- In the case of a tie, the winner will be decided on a countback system as recommended by Golf Australia.
- Club to supply all medals. Medals to be presented at Club Presentation.

#### ECLECTIC COMPETITIONS

There is a Summer and a Winter Eclectic Competition as per the current Fixture.

- 75% of players playing handicap will be applied and players handicaps will be locked prior to the commencement of the final round.
- Scores from single player stroke, stableford and par events on Saturday competitions are the only scores to count towards Eclectic.
- Scores are entered automatically and can be viewed in MiClub.
- Disqualified Scores are not accepted.
- Players can only win either Gross or Nett, cannot win both trophies.
- There is a Gross and Nett winner for each Eclectic event. Gross score takes priority over Nett score.
- In the event of a tie, the result will be calculated on a countback for an 18-hole competition as recommended by Golf Australia.
- Club to supply trophies. Trophies to be presented at Club Presentation.

#### GRAHAM WILLIAMS MEMORIAL TROPHY

4BBB Par Knockout Event.

- 8 Pairs to qualify for playoffs.
- In the event of a tie for qualifying, the result will be calculated on countback as recommended by Golf Australia.
- In playoffs, 1st plays 8th, 2nd plays 7th, etc. and will continue as per knockout draw through to the final round.
- Playoff rounds are Match Play format.
- Quarter final, semi-final and final matches must be played by the dates shown on the published draw. This draw is posted on the Men's noticeboard and on the QPGC Website.
- In playoff rounds, in the case of a tie, the matches will continue in sudden death play until there is a result.
- Club to supply trophies and update head trophy held at Club. Trophies to be presented at Club Presentation.

#### SINGLES KNOCKOUT EVENT. (PREVIOUSLY W.S. KIDDLE SHIELD)

Singles Stroke play Knockout Event.

- Top 8 players to qualify.
- In the event of a tie for qualifying, the result will be calculated on countback as recommended by Golf Australia.
- In playoffs, 1st plays 8th, 2nd plays 7th, etc. and will continue as per knockout draw through to the final round.
- After qualifying round, all further rounds will be Match Play format.
- In playoff rounds, in the case of a tie, the matches will continue in sudden death play until there is a result.
- This draw is posted on the Men's noticeboard and on the QPGC Website.
- All matches leading up to the final round must be played by the dates shown on the published draw.
- Absence for a good reason such as illness may be considered acceptable for not playing by the due date by the Club Match Committee.
- The players named first in each match are deemed to be the challengers and are responsible for arranging the match.

- Should the challengers be unable to organise a suitable time for the match with the other players, or, other players cannot be contacted by the challengers at least one week before the due date of the match. Then the problem shall be referred to the Club Match Committee by either party.
- The winners are responsible for notifying the Mens Club Captain and placing the results on the draw posted on the Men's noticeboard within 1 week of the match being played. Failure to do both things will result in disqualification of the winners.
- Matches cannot be played concurrently with any other Club competition.
- Club to supply trophy and update board. Trophy to be presented at Club Presentation.

#### HANDICAPPERS TROPHY

Best total Nett score over the 3 qualifying rounds of the Club Championships.

- Maximum handicap of 54.
- In the event of a tie, the result will be calculated on countback as recommended by Golf Australia.
- The countback will be from the final round (3rd round) scores.
- Club to supply trophy and update honour board. Trophy to be presented at Club Presentation.

#### WATACH TROPHY

Stableford event for Mid-week competitions as per current Fixture.

- Best 4 scores from the 6 rounds are counted.
- In the case of a tie, the result will be decided on the final round score. Failure to decide will be countback on second last round etc. until a result has been achieved.
- Trophy given to winner to be supplied by Michael Watach.
- Trophy kept at Clubrooms to be engraved by Michael Watach.

#### PETER BESEI MEMORIAL SHIELD

Order of Merit based competition as per current Fixture.

- Saturday single player competition scores only. (i.e. stroke, stableford and par events).
- Points will be awarded for the top 50 players based on their Nett score. The best score will receive 50 points with the remainder awarded on a sliding scale down to the 50th player who will get 1 point.
- In the event of a tie, the best average Nett score over the event will be deemed the winner.
- Trophy to be supplied by Gary Besei, Club to update Shield.

#### RIVERSIDE CLASSIC

4 rounds of Stroke held midweek as per current Fixture.

- Best 3 scores from the 4 rounds are counted.
- In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided by countback as recommended by Golf Australia.
- Club to supply trophy. Trophy to be presented at Club Presentation.

#### COCK'S CHALLENGE

6 rounds of Stableford held midweek as per current Fixture.

- Best 4 scores from the 6 rounds are counted.
- In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided by countback as recommended by Golf Australia.
- Club to supply trophy. Trophy to be presented at Club Presentation.

#### MIDWEEK MASTERS

4 rounds of Stableford held midweek as per current Fixture.

- Best 3 scores from the 4 rounds are counted.
- In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided by countback as recommended by Golf Australia.
- Club to supply trophy. Trophy to be presented at Club Presentation.

## ANTHONY CELI MEMORIAL SHIELD

3 Rounds of Stableford as set in the current Club Fixture.

- In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided by countback as recommended by Golf Australia.
- Trophy to be supplied by Vince Celi. Club to update the shield.

### **I. CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS - Men**

Stroke event played off Scratch (No Handicap applied)

Men's Club Championships must be played every year and takes priority over all Club events.

#### QUALIFICATIONS TO PLAY

- Players must be full financial members of QPGC at the time of the 1st qualifying round of the Club Championships.
- Players must have been a member of QPGC for 6 months prior to playing in the first qualifying round.
- Must hold a current GA handicap.
- If a member does not meet the above conditions, it is up to the QPGC Club Match Committee's discretion to allow the member to qualify.
- A member must have returned no less than 10 single competition event scorecards or 5 single competition scorecards for Juniors, from the last Club Championship round and the first qualifying round of the forthcoming Club Championship event.
- If a player has not played 10 rounds as per last point, it is up to the QPGC Club Match Committee to give the player permission to play and qualify.
- Players chosen to represent the Club in District Events shall have those games recorded as qualifying games.

#### RULES OF PLAY

There will be 3 qualifying rounds of stroke play (54 holes) to be played, with play to be from the GA permanent markers.

- Once a Championship round has been played and completed it must stand and be recorded.
- All other remaining Championship Qualifying rounds are to be played and completed as soon as practicable.
- After completion of all the qualifying rounds (54 holes), the final round players will be considered qualified for their respective grade, based upon the following criteria:
  - The top 6 placed players, and;
  - Any player tied for 6th place, and;
  - Any player within 6 strokes of the best qualifying score.
- The final round of Club Championships is to be played on the Saturday following the last qualifying round, with play to be from the permanent markers. If not possible to play the following Saturday for a good reason, to be played at the earliest Saturday possible.
- On the completion of the Final Round, the Club Champion will be decided by the player with the lowest Gross (no handicap applied) Score of all Club Championship competitors. All other grades will be decided by the lowest Gross score in their respective grades.
- In the event for a tie for any grade, including Club Champion, after completion of the final round; a sudden death playoff from the first hole will be played until a result has been achieved.
- In the event of a tie for runner up Champion in any grade; this will be decided on a countback system on the final round as recommended by Golf Australia.



## SENIOR AND JUNIOR

- The Senior and Junior Champions will be decided after 3 qualifying Club Championship rounds.
- In the event of a tie in either event, a further 18 holes will be played on the same day as the Club Championship final round.
- The same rules will apply for the respective champions and Runner-ups as in all other Championship Grades.
- Eligibility for Seniors is 70 years or older at time of first qualifying round.
- Eligibility for Juniors is under 18 years old at time of first qualifying round.
- Dates of birth must be provided to the QPGC to qualify for both events before first qualifying round is played.

## TROPHIES AWARDED FOR CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS

- J. GRINTER TROPHY – CLUB CHAMPION  
To be updated each year with current Club champions' name. Kept at Club.
- ALL GRADE TROPHIES (B, C & D GRADES)
  - Winners
  - Runners-up (incl. runner-up club champion)
- SENIOR CHAMPION (OVER 3 QUALIFYING ROUNDS)
- JUNIOR CHAMPION (OVER 3 QUALIFYING ROUNDS)
- All trophies to be supplied by Club and presented at Club Presentation.

## HANDICAP'S FOR SUDDEN DEATH PLAYOFF'S – HANDICAPPED EVENTS ONLY

Once any handicapped event goes to a sudden death playoff after 18 holes have been played, there will be strokes given by hole in the same way as in the round. For example: If a player has been given a stroke on the first hole of the round, when playing the same hole again in a playoff will receive the same stroke as awarded in the first 18 holes played.

## **J. DAILY COMPETITION HANDICAP GRADES & PRIZE PAYOUTS – WOMEN.**

### **SATURDAY:**

Minimum 7 players needed for a competition. Less than 20 players, only ONE trophy, at Match Committee's discretion.

- Division 1: 0 – 23 Daily handicaps, Division 2: 24– 54 Daily handicaps

### **WEDNESDAY:**

Minimum 10 players needed for a competition.

Less than 19 players, only ONE trophy.

19 players or more, THREE trophies, or at the Match Committee's discretion.

- Division 1: 0 – 23 handicaps, Division 2: 24– 28 handicaps,
- Division 3: 29 – 54 handicaps.

Handicap divisions are based on GA Daily Handicaps and may be altered at the Match Committee's discretion.

### **EAGLES:**

Each daily competition will have a \$30 payout for eagles.

Recipient to be awarded on day, on a par 4 or 5 (except in Ambrose or foursome event) Trophy to be awarded at Annual Presentation.

### **HOLE IN ONE:**

Each daily competition will have a \$30 payout for a Hole-in-one.

The recipient to receive a hole in one trophy on any competition day, on a par 3.

## **DAILY COMPETITION PAYOUT'S**

### **Competition Payout breakdown**

- Grade winners will receive \$25 per grade (where applicable, see below),
- Balls will be paid to top % of field, proportionate to remaining overall daily % limits.
- In competitions with less than 20 players, winning payout will be calculated depending on the number of players entered in the competition and other prizes awarded.
- All competition payouts will be subject to the following:
  - No more than 70% of competition fees taken is to be paid out as prizes.
  - Eagles and Holes-in-one payouts do not affect daily competition percentage payouts.
  - There may be variations to payout figures specified above, subject to Womens Club Captain's (or authorised representative's) absolute discretion.

### **NEAREST THE PIN:**

The Ball must be on the putting surface. There will be three Wednesday and two Saturday nearest the pins in each competition at the Womens Club Captains discretion.

When there are nine hole out and nine hole in; NTP's will be reduced.

**GROSS EVENTS:** Will be held on both Wednesday (three Divisions) and Saturday (two Divisions) as in Fixture.

**TROPHY DONORS:** As a matter of etiquette trophy donors are requested not to accept their own trophy.

## ELECTIC, BIRDIES AND PUTTING TROPHIES

- Eclectic and Putting Scores are generally entered automatically and can be viewed in MiClub after completion and close of the competition. If using a score card; Putting strokes are to be recorded beside scores and handed in for recording.
- ECLECTIC gross and nett prizes for both Wednesday and Saturday recorded over the season (i.e. from 1st round of Stroke & Putting competition at the beginning of the season to the final round in September as in Fixture).
- Players can only win either Gross or Nett, cannot win both trophies. Gross score takes priority over Nett score.
- Scores from single player stroke, stableford (including 9 hole stableford events) and par events on Wednesday and Saturday competitions are the only scores to count towards Eclectic.
- 50% of players playing handicap will be applied prior to the commencement of the final round to record the season's final nett results.
- Disqualified Scores are not accepted.
- BIRDIES may be entered anytime on the birdie sheet, except during Ambrose, 4BBB and Foursomes.
- PUTTING is from 9 best rounds both Saturday and Wednesday.
- In the event of a tie in all above events, all winning players will receive a trophy.
- Club to supply trophies. Trophies to be presented at Annual Presentation.

## K. CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS - WOMEN

This is a 3 x 18-hole gross STROKE event in 5 Divisions, as set out below, with play to be from the permanent markers.

	Division C:	26.0 – 33.0	all Divisions
	Division D:	33.1 – 54.0	
	Seniors:	0 – 54.0 (70 years +)	

Division B, C and D grades to be reviewed annually, however it is recommended that regardless of how many players are in Division A, this handicap division remains unaltered.

### QUALIFICATIONS TO PLAY:

- Players must be full financial members of the Queens Park Golf Club at the time of the 1<sup>st</sup> qualifying round of the Club Championships.
- Players must have been a member of QPGC for 6 months prior to playing in the first qualifying round.
- Must hold a current GA handicap.
- A member must have returned no less than 10 single competition event scorecards or 5 single competition scorecards for Juniors, from the last Club Championship round and the first qualifying round of the forthcoming Club Championship event.
- If a player has not played 10 rounds as per last point, it is up to the Womens Club Captain and Match Committee's discretion to give the player permission to play and qualify.
- Players chosen to represent the Club in District Events shall have those games recorded as qualifying games.
- All Wednesday players must be ready to hit off 15 minutes prior to their time allocated. If late they will be disqualified from the Championships but may enter the daily competition, playing at the end of the field, at the match committees' discretion.
- Eligible players for Saturday qualifying rounds. Working women who do not play midweek competition on a regular basis.

## RULES OF PLAY:

- Wednesday First and Second weeks will be drawn one week prior to the first round. Tee times drawn are not interchangeable. Should cancellation occur the next name drawn shall fill the vacancy in all 3 rounds in perspective division.
- Saturday qualifying rounds; timesheet for eligible players. Names must be entered on the online timesheet. The Women's Club Captain or her representative has the right to move names to appropriate time slots.
- The third final round from Wednesday and Saturday qualifiers will be seeded.
- If handicap is increased or broken during the Championships, the handicap of the 1st round of play shall prevail throughout (This does not apply to the competition of the day)
- In the event of a tie in all divisions, a sudden death playoff from the first hole, on the final day of the Championships will be played. Match Committee to arrange for referees in the case of a play-off in all Divisions.
- In the event of a tie for the runner-up in any division, it shall be decided by a Countback on the final round, as recommended by Golf Australia. A player is eligible to win only one trophy in any Division and Seniors.

## L. WOMENS TROPHY EVENTS –UPDATED December 2024

### THE GOLDEN PUTTER

Best 3 rounds of PUTTING from 18 hole STROKE events as specified in Fixture.

Golden Putter to be open to all Lady Members.

- In the event of a tie as per G.A. recommended Countback system on the best 18 holes. If it is not possible to get a winner (due to the App only being accessible by the player), then the tied players putts to count on the next stroke and putting round – the lowest number of putts wins the tie.
- Trophy to be supplied by the Club, winners name inscribed on the PUTTER displayed on the club wall. Presented at the Annual Presentation.

#### NOTE:

Ongoing Club events which include Wednesdays & Saturday may be entered only once. A player must nominate the day of choice prior to start of play. If no indication is made on the day of play, the player will automatically be entered on the first day of this competition.

### LYN MALLETT GOBBLERS TROPHY

The most GOBBLERS in the current season.

- The ball must be holed out from off the green with any club. May be recorded during partner rounds. Includes both Wednesdays and Saturdays.
- If more than one winner, there is to be a "gobble off" (off the green) – 6 balls each to play into or nearest the hole.

To be Refereed by the Womens Club Captain or Match Committee representative.

Trophy to be donated by Lyn Mallett. Presented at the Annual Presentation.

### LILLIAN HOBBS TROPHY

Singles MATCH PLAY KNOCKOUT.

- Play to commence from 1st tee. Play off PERMANENT RED MARKERS. (Players MUST notify Golf Shop prior to playing.)
- Matches can be played Saturdays, at any time including Club competition. However, matches can be played before or after competition on Wednesday. Captain must be notified.

- Handicap allowance. The number of strokes given is the full daily handicap difference. Where the full daily handicap difference exceeds 18, players should receive 2 or 3 strokes per hole, where applicable.
- The player whose name is at the top of the draw is responsible for arranging that match and has the honour.

1st match must be PLAYED by July 1st.

2nd match must be PLAYED by August 1st.

3rd match must be PLAYED by September 1<sup>st</sup>.

4th match must be PLAYED by October 1<sup>st</sup>.

The 5<sup>th</sup> final match must be played by October 30th or at the Match Committee's discretion. (If required) All dates are at the discretion of the Match Committee.

- If above matches are not PLAYED or walkover is not granted by above dates, both players will be disqualified.
- It is the responsibility of both players to contact the Womens Club Captain of the day before the commencement of the final match.
- If match all square after 18 holes, a sudden death playoff applies. Strokes to be given as previously.
- Womens Club Captain or person nominated by the Womens Club Captain to referee the final round.

Trophy to be supplied by the Club.

Winners name to be inscribed on the Cup and must be returned to the Club prior to the Annual Presentation. Presented at the Annual Presentation.

#### MONTHLY MEDALS (WEDNESDAY)

This competition is an 18 hole stroke\* event and must be played off the permanent G.A. markers.

- In the event of a tie, it must be a playoff, and must be played on or by the next stroke/ Medal Day. This is arranged by the Womens Club Captain, Vice-Captain, or Match Committee.
- 20 Players required for a Medal Competition
- Seven (7) Medals per year – Course conditions permitting.
- There will be included in the above Medal rounds, one 18 hole \*Stableford event to be played off the permanent G.A. markers.
- In the event of a tie, it must be a playoff, and must be played on or by the next Wednesday Medal Day.
- A member can only win one medal in each year.
- The Monthly Medal events are open to all Queens Park Golf Club financial women members who hold a current GA handicap.

Trophy - Club Medal. Presented on the day of competition.

#### MAY McAUSLAN TROPHY (MEDAL OF MEDALISTS)

All players who have won a Monthly Medal during the year shall compete in the 18 hole STROKE event as specified in the Fixture. Qualifiers must not play in the same group.

- In the event of a tie, a playoff to be held at the next stroke round at Womens Club Captain, Vice-Captain, or Match Committee's discretion. If still a tie, as per G.A. recommended Countback system. The trophy is the Perpetual Cup to be inscribed and held for twelve (12) months. Winner's name to be inscribed on the board displayed in the club house. Small trophy to be supplied by Club for winner to keep.

Presented at the Annual Presentation. Perpetual Cup to be returned at the end of the twelve months.

#### QUARTELY MEDALS (SATURDAY)

NETT event over 18 holes.

- Must be played off the Permanent markers.
- Four (4) medals per year as shown in the Fixture.
- A member can only win one medal in each year.

- All medal winners are eligible to play for the Medal of Medallists as shown in the Fixture.
- Qualifiers must not play in the same group unless it is unavoidable, due to the numbers of players in the field.
- In the event of a tie, a play-off on the first available stroke round.
- Presented on the day of play.

#### TIE FOR SATURDAY MEDAL OF MEDALISTS:

- If there is a tie then players may arrange a play-off to suit both players, prior to the end of the current season. If still tied both players will receive a prize and both names added to trophy.
- FOUR (4) medals will be supplied by the Club.
- The Medal of Medallists name to be inscribed on the Board by the Club.
- The Medal of Medallists trophy to be donated by the Club
- Medal of Medallists trophy to be presented at the Annual Presentation.

#### PRESIDENT'S TROPHY

Best GROSS score in the current season – as in Fixture. Wednesday and Saturday inclusive (the course must be 67 Par).

- To be played off the permanent markers.
- In the event of a tie as per G.A. recommended Countback system.
- Trophy to be supplied by the Club. Presented at the Annual Presentation.

#### CAPTAIN'S TROPHY

This is a Stroke event. It is a three round NET AGGREGATE as specified in the Fixture.

- In the event of a tie as per G.A. recommended Countback system on the best card to be applied.
- Trophy to be supplied by the Club. Presented at the Annual Presentation

#### PLEASE NOTE:

Ongoing Club events which include Wednesdays & Saturdays may be entered only once. A player must nominate the day of choice prior to start of play. Players entering on a Wednesday are not eligible to enter on a Saturday & vice versa. If no indication is made on day of play, the player will automatically be entered on the first day of this competition.

#### JANET SHARP TROPHY

AGGREGATE of the three best NETT stroke rounds on days specified in the fixture – to be played in conjunction with the Club Championships.

- In the event of a tie, as per G.A. recommended Countback system over all three rounds.
- Trophy to be donated by Janet Sharp. Presented at the Annual Presentation.

#### RITA AND KRISTY ZENK TROPHY

AGGREGATE of the three best GROSS stroke rounds on days specified in the Fixture. Trophy to be rotated through A, B & C Divisions annually, with Divisions as follows:

Division A – 0 – 19

Division B – 20 – 29

Division C – 30 – 54

- The handicap of a player in the first round will determine the Grade of the player.
- To commence with Division C in 2025.
- In the event of a tie as per G.A. recommended Countback system, over all three rounds.
- Trophy to be donated by Rita Zenk. Presented at the Annual Presentation.

#### LIFE MEMBERS' TROPHY

The best overall score PAR as specified in the Fixture. Wednesday and Saturday inclusive.

- In the event of a tie as per G.A. recommended Countback system.
- Trophy to be donated by the Club.
- Name to be inscribed on the Shield by the Club.

- Presented at the Annual Presentation. The Shield is to be returned in time for the next annual Presentation.

#### DOROTHY MacLEOD MEMORIAL VETERANS' TROPHY

Best NETT score in STROKE event on the day specified in the Fixture.

- Competitors must be 60 years of age or over on the day of competition.
- In the event of a tie as per G.A. recommended Countback system.
- Trophy to be donated by Mesdames J. Rigg, J. Doherty, G. Hassett, S. Smith. Presented at the Annual Presentation.

#### QUEENS PARK SHIELD

This is a 4BBB STABLEFORD event on the days specified in the Fixture. Wednesday & Saturday.

- In the event of a tie, as per G.A. recommended Countback system.
- Supplied by the Club. Shield on Club wall to be inscribed by the Club.
- Winners must be financial members of Queens Park Golf Club to have name engraved on Shield.
- A member playing with a guest in a fourball major event is ineligible to win.
- This event may be entered on Wednesday and Saturday, with the same partner or a new partner.
- Presented at the Annual Presentation.

#### ARTHUR & JANICE BINNS PERPETUAL TROPHY

TWO PERSON AMBROSE – select own partner, Saturday only as specified in the Fixture.

- Place within one club length of chosen ball. Ball may be putted out.
- In the event of a tie, as per GA recommended Countback system.

#### IRENE ADAMS TROPHY

This is a three round 4BBB STABLEFORD AGGREGATE event as specified in the Fixture.

- Trophy to be donated by Karen Lindmayer. Presented at the Annual Presentation.

#### MARION WATT SHIELD

Best NETT score from Official Opening Day as in the fixture Wednesday and Saturday.

- In the event of a tie as per G.A. recommended Countback system.
- Trophy to be donated by the Watt Family.
- Names to be engraved on Shield in the Clubhouse Presented at the Annual Presentation.

#### GAYLE CONNOR TROPHY

Best overall scores over 3 rounds of STABLEFORD as specified in the fixture for both Wednesday and Saturday.

- In the event of a tie, as per G.A. recommended Countback system over all three rounds. Wednesday or Saturday.
- Two trophies to be donated by Gayle Connor, but no member can win both competitions. Presented at the Annual Presentation.

#### LIZ RABBAS HANDICAP TROPHY

Wednesday and Saturday ladies who have most improved handicap in the current season.

To be worked out as follows: -

- 30-54 handicap                      3 points per stroke

- 19-29 handicap                    4 points per stroke
- Scr-18 handicap                    5 points per stroke
- Commencing First Day of Eclectic in January to last week, (7 days) prior to the annual presentation.
- In the event of a tie, Exact Handicap wins e.g., 30.2 wins over 30.3.
- Winners name to be inscribed on the trophy by the Club.
- Trophy to be donated by Liz Rabbas and presented at the Annual Presentation.

#### WOMEN'S ORDER OF MERIT TROPHY

Overall highest number of points gained throughout the season allocated from qualifying GROSS, NETT, STABLEFORD and PAR women's events. Wednesday and Saturday

- In the event of a tie GA recommended Countback system on final Wednesday or Saturday round in the season when both players entered.
- Trophy to be donated by Sue McLean and presented at the Annual Presentation.

#### LUCY STONE TROPHY

AGGREGATE of the three best eligible NETT Stroke rounds completed during the season, Wednesday competition only.

- In the event of a tie, as per GA recommended Countback system over best three cards.
- Trophy to be donated by Lucy Stone. Presented at the Annual Presentation.

#### 9 HOLE COMPETITION

To be held on Wednesdays during Competition times. Competition is STABLEFORD regardless of the day's scheduled competition type.

- Bookings can be made on MiClub Bookings timesheet prior to day in allocated time slots on 10<sup>th</sup> or 1<sup>st</sup> Tees from around 9.18am. (This enables a separate 9-hole competition to be set up for use of the MiScore App). Alternatively use a score card and fill in details as per normal 9-hole competition and submit at end of round. Entry fee - \$4
- This competition is handicapped.

- Open to new members who joined Queens Park on or after the first day of previous seasons commencement of eclectic in January, to final eclectic round in current season.
- In the event of a tie as per G.A. recommended Countback system.
- Trophy to be donated by Jane Simpson. Presented at the Annual Presentation.

NOTE: All scores converted to Stableford points.

Mixed Pinehurst Foursomes event. A member only event.

- The best 4 pairs gross scores to qualify for finals.

### MIXED AMBROSE EVENTS

Mixed Ambrose events may be run throughout the season on Saturdays at the Match Committee's discretion.

- Teams with a minimum of one each gender.
- Trophies to be presented on the day of play depending on number of teams entered.
- A minimum team combined handicap may be applied.
